Eligible Grants:

The Pillager Education Foundation will accept and consider grant applications that align with the above mission statement. The Grant Committee looks for innovative ideas for classroom support and enhancement.

Eligible Applicants:

Pillager School employees may submit a grant application. Non Pillager School employees wanting to submit a grant are encouraged to contact an employee to work together on the project.

Grant Amounts:

We expect the maximum grant award will generally be \$500.00, however may be more depending on funding and applications submitted.

Ineligible Projects:

- Expenses incurred prior to notice that the grant has been awarded.
- Expenses that typically are covered by school budget.
- Religious organizations for direct religious activities.
- Political campaigns or lobbying activities.

Timelines:

Deadlines may vary from year to year. Please check the website for the grant application.

Requirements if grant is awarded:

- Complete the Pillager Education Foundation Grant Follow-up Report. This report includes questions about the project and a report on how the funds were spent. Copy of receipts will be required. .
